This evening the Singapore International Chamber of Commerce (SICC) officially celebrated its 180th anniversary in Singapore with a gala dinner at Marina Bay Sands. Mr. Teo Chee Hean, Deputy Prime Minister and Co-ordinating Minister for National Security was the Guest of Honour.

700 guests comprising business leaders, Chamber members, members of the Diplomatic Corps, Singapore government officials, representatives of trade and business associations and local and foreign media attended.

In his address SICC Chairman Mr. Chaly Mah said:

"SICC is a good example of a company that keeps innovating to stay relevant and to thrive."

As part of the celebrations, the Chamber presented endowed gifts of SGD 400,000 each to the Singapore Management University and to the Singapore University of Technology and Design.
